

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How is this Mass different than other Masses?

During Mass, anniversary couples will be invited to stand in their pews, face one another, and hold hands as they renew their commitment and are given a special blessing by the Archbishop.

2. Where will I get the materials for the Mass?

The materials for the Mass will be distributed at the front and side entrance of the Cathedral.

3. May family and friends come with us?

We encourage family and friends to celebrate with you. Guests do not need to register for the Mass.

4. Is there reserved seating for anniversary couples?

Anniversary couples and guests are invited to sit together and may sit anywhere they prefer, but there is no reserved seating for the general public. We will hold several seats near the altar for those who might be in a wheelchair, use a walker, or need an ASL interpreter.

5. How will the photos be taken?

Our staff photographer will be taking photos of the Mass throughout the service to include as many couples and families as possible. Following the Mass, group photos with the Archbishop will be arranged by anniversary years.

6. Will we be able to obtain the group photos?

Complimentary photos can be viewed and downloaded at bostoncatholicphotos.com. Information will be provided on the Mass program.

7. Can a family or friend take a photo with our camera *Yes, however, please advise them to remain behind the professional photographer so the professional photos may be taken without interference.*

8. When should we arrive?

You should arrive no earlier than 2:15 PM as the Cathedral is in use up until that time and our staff will be unavailable until 2:15 PM. We ask for all to honor this request as it becomes very crowded in the lobby entrance and is not safe for our guests when crowds are exiting prior services. Thank you!

9. Where should we park?

*Parking lot options will be mailed to you with your invitation to the Mass approx. mid-October. **We recommend dropping off guests who are not able to walk distances.***

10. Is the church handicap accessible?

Yes, the church is handicap accessible. It is best to sit close to the sanctuary on the left to be close to the elevator which leads to the handicap restroom.

11. Will there be a reception following Mass?

Unfortunately, due to ongoing events, there is not a reception following the Mass.

12. Someone in my party is deaf, will an interpreter be provided?
